The days are short in the winter, which allows many hobbyists to take photos of the Northern lights, and our long summer days help to extend the short growing season if you enjoy keeping a garden. Home of the Northern Manitoba Trapper's Festival, which takes place every winter, The Pas is a town that enjoys celebrating its history and culture. We have several schools, a college, grocery stores, summer farmer's market, and the local industries include agriculture, forestry, commercial fishing, health and education.

The Clearwater Midwives is a practice of two midwives; we carry full scope privileges with a level two hospital, which has anesthesia and caesarian section capacity. There are two obstetricians in the community who we consult with, as well as family practitioners. A large portion of our clients are First Nations and Metis people, so knowledge and experience with these groups would be an asset. We provide regular prenatal and postpartum services to Moose Lake, a First Nation community about 1-1.5hr by road from The Pas.
