Purpose of consultancy:	To conduct an assessment of the 3-year midwifery education pilot program in DPRK	
Scope of work:	Background	
(Description of services, activities, or outputs)	The Ministry of Public Health of DPRK with technical assistance from UNFPA developed the DPRK National Strategic Plan for Midwifery (2017-2021)- to ensure quality birth assistance to reduce maternal and neonatal mortality. The strategy recognizes midwifery as a supportive and comprehensive intervention that contributes significantly to the reduction of maternal and neonatal mortality by providing quality care for pregnant and lactating women and newborns during the antenatal, birthing and postnatal period.	
	Since the inception of midwifery education in DPRK, midwives have been trained at the basic certificate level which was not equivalent to those who graduated in universities. This midwifery education system was not competency based education and did not conform to the global standards of midwifery education that is in line with the International Confederation of Midwives (ICM). With the increasing diversity in health issues, the emergence of new reproductive health problems and the expanding role of the midwife, it was deemed necessary to educate midwives at a higher level. This meant introducing a minimum of three years pre-service education program that is competency- based in line with the ICM standards. In 2015, with the support of UNFPA, the government of DPRK introduced a new 3 year-midwifery curriculum which was rolled out on pilot basis at the Pyongyang Medical College for a batch of 60 students. This first batch of students graduated in March 2018.	
	Since the government intends to adopt the 3 year-curriculum nationwide it is important to assess the pilot programme which rolled out the curriculum.	
	The purpose of this consultancy is to assess the implementation of the 3 –year midwifery pilot programme in DPRK and develop an evidence base to inform the government's future plans to upscale the pilot programme at the national level by introducing the 3-year competency based midwifery education to all midwifery schools in the country. The assessment will fulfil the following objectives:	
	 Effectiveness- To what extent have the objectives of the pilot project been achieved? This will include the content of the curriculum capacity of teachers to teach the new curriculum and teaching aids and methodology used- the effectiveness of the curriculum in developing competencies of teachers, teaching aids, developing competencies of the students to provide quality midwifery care; its contribution to raising the profile of midwifery with opportunities on career development in midwifery. Relevance- Are objectives of the curriculum keeping with locally defined needs and priorities? Responsiveness –Are the teaching aids, methodology responsive to the needs of the student? 	
	 Impact –what are the over-all significance of the 3 year midwifery education program to develop high level competencies of midwives? 	

	Literature review including the National Strategic Plan for Midwifery in DPRK and other relevant documents and policies; Review the 3- year curriculum on midwifery for the Pyongyang Medical College; Develop the design and workplan for the assessment and submit to UNFPA, MOPH and the Education Commission; Develop the instruments for assessment and present assessment tools to UNFPA, Education Commission and the Ministry of Public Health; Conduct the assessment in country in close consultation with relevant national and international stakeholders; Prepare and submit the assessment report with concrete recommendations for action.
