**Recommendations** Whereas CAM has not had an official forum to honour midwives who have passed on from this life;

MOTION Rebecca Wood, seconded by Carol Cameron:

Be it resolved that CAM provide a forum for honouring the lives and grieving the loss of our colleagues. This may include a moment of silence at our annual meeting, a time of reflection or a shared story. Member Associations will be invited to identifying people to be honoured.

**Expected implications:** Respect and shared inspiration from the life of a midwife who is now deeply mourned.

## 9.2.Resolution: AGM2018\_002 CAM Statements to Update and Create- Proposed by:

Rebecca Wood, RM, Winnipeg, Manitoba

**Background:** CAM represents midwives across Canada. Midwives are experts in informed choice decision-making, person-centered care, and evidence-informed practice. At a recent meeting with Midwife SOGC Associate members, we discussed the need for a strong midwifery voice on some key topics in which midwives have expertise:

- homebirth
- waterbirth
- harm reduction.

#### Recommendations:

Whereas midwives are experts in homebirth and waterbirth and; Whereas midwives are experts in person-centred care and informed choice; Be it resolved that: • CAM update our homebirth statement • CAM write a statement on waterbirth • CAM write a statement on harm-reduction with cannabis use Expected implications: Midwifery recognized as a leader in these topics with an approach that is person-centered, based on informed choice decisions, and evidence-informed.

2018-25-AGM: MOTION to amend by Betty Anne Daviss to add Breech Birth to list of statements, seconded by Kim Campbell.

MOTION Opposed by Rebecca Wood.

### Discussion:

- not part of midwifery scope of practice
- Not part of our expertise in agreements
- To consider other ways Breech Birth can be supported- serious issue that needs to be addressed.
- Amendment withdrawn by Betty Anne Daviss

2018-26-AGM MOTION to amend by Sarilyn Zimmerman, seconded by Madeline Clin to change wording to harm reduction for substance use rather than cannabis use.

#### Discussion:

- Don't think midwives are experts in harm reduction.
- Cannabis statement with principle of harm reduction is timely
- SOGC has statement that is based
- Require statement that is person centred-gives room to people to make choices.

Vote on harm reduction amendment:
