As a territorial midwifery practice leader, the incumbent will provide clinical practice support to Registered Midwives of the Northwest Territories Health and Social Services System. The incumbent will initially supervise three Registered Midwives, ultimately supervising up to 13 full-time midwives within three years. The position provides primary midwifery care, on a limited basis, in Yellowknife and other various sites in the Northwest Territories.
