The School of Nursing and Midwifery at Mount Royal University invites applications for or a one-year limited-term appointment in the Bachelor of Midwifery program, which will commence summer 2020, or a date to be negotiated, subject to final budgetary approval. Preference will be given to candidates with appropriate academic experience. Priority will be given to candidates with experience in midwifery education.

The School of Nursing and Midwifery currently offers degree programs in Midwifery and Nursing, a distance certificate program for registered nurses, and a bridging program for internationally educated nurses. The successful applicant must be qualified to teach all levels of midwifery theory and clinical in the Midwifery program as well as participate in course, program, and curricular revisions and development. Active engagement in the midwifery community in Canada is an expectation. Relevant and current certification and immunizations for the practice area (including Alberta Health Services) are required.

New faculty are hired into one of two work patterns. The teaching/ scholarship/ service pattern (TSS) has a focus on teaching with the requirement that the faculty member be involved in a research program as well as service to the Mount Royal community. The teaching/ service pattern (TS) has a focus on teaching and service only.

A Ph.D. in Midwifery or related field is preferred. A Bachelor's and Master's degree in Midwifery or related field is required. One of the undergraduate or graduate degrees must be in midwifery. The successful candidate should have a minimum of five years of current Midwifery experience. The successful candidate must be eligible for and maintain registration with the College of Midwives of Alberta. Applicants interested in the teaching/scholarship/service pattern must demonstrate the ability and intent to pursue a research program.
