
ADDICTION

Why people turn to drugs and alcohol:

Some people turn to drugs and alcohol to escape from their problems, because they are pressured by friends or because they lack confidence

Steps from addiction to recovery:

- **1.** Experimentation. Very few people set out to become addicted.
- **2.** Regular Use & Abuse. In this next stage on the road toward addiction, something that was once considered recreational or temporary becomes a lifestyle.
- **3.** Dependency and tolerance.
- **4.** Addiction
- **5.** *Detox, treatment and recovery.*



ACCESS TO CONTRACEPTION

I was so anxious. My school was interrupted by COVID-19 and my boyfriend lost his job. The first few weeks, I was worried about my future, family and economy. My boyfriend and me started to spend more time together, which made me worried of unwanted pregnancy. I went to a Youth Friendly Clinic. They treated me well.

SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19

- → Fever

- → Diarrhea

WHAT IS COVID-19?

COVID-19 is a virus that infects your lungs.

People can catch Covid-19 from people who are infected even if they don't have any symptoms. This happens when an infected person breathes, talks, sneezes, or coughs less than 2m away. These can land in the nose, mouth, or eyes of someone nearby, or be breathed in.

LAM METHOD (BREASTFEEDING)

If no method of birth control is used, there is an 85% chance of getting pregnant after 1 year of having sex. With perfect use (you follow the exact directions all the time) LAM is 98% effective against pregnancy for the first 3 months after giving birth.

CONFLICT RESOLUTION PROCESS IN FIVE STEPS:

Step 1:

Define the source of the conflict.

Step 2:

Look beyond the incident. Be empathetic. Try and see things from the other person's point of view.

Step 3:

Request solutions.

Step 4:

Identify solutions both disputants can support.

Step 5:

Agreement.

CONFLICT RESOLUTION

A conflict is a clash of interest. The basis of conflict may vary but it is always a part of society.

Basis of conflict may be:

- *→* Personal
- → Racial
- → Class
- → Caste
- → Political and international

Conflict can be normal. Most conflict is not violent.




BE A PEACEBUILDER




MORNING AFTER PILL

The ECP morning-after pill is a type of emergency contraception. It is used to prevent pregnancy for women and girls who have had unprotected sex, whose birth control method has failed, or who have been raped. The morning-after pill is NOT a primary method of birth control.

Use if: You had unprotected intercourse in the last 72 hours and are worried about unwanted pregnancy.






WHAT IS AN STI?

STI means a Sexually Transmitted Infection. STI is a bacteria, virus, or parasite. They are most often transmitted through contact with infection and your eyes, nose, mouth or genitals. Anyone can get an STI.

Symptoms:

- → Sores or bumps on the genitals (or in the oral or rectal area)
- → Painful or burning urination
- → Discharge from the penis
- → Unusual or odd-smelling vaginal discharge
- → Unusual vaginal bleeding
- *→* Pain during sex
- → Sore, swollen lymph nodes, particularly in the groin but sometimes more widespread
- → Lower abdominal pain
- → Fever
- \rightarrow Rash over the trunk, hands or feet



COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT

HIV

Transmission:

HIV is transmitt ed through semen, vaginal fl uids, blood and breast milk. And direct contact with open wounds, or mucous membranes like eyes, nose, mouth, anus, vagina and penis.

Prevention:

- → Use condoms. Condoms are 95% effective in reducing the risk of HIV.
- → Do not share needles.
- *→ Know your status. Get tested.*

Treatment:

- → If you are HIV positive and pregnant, talk to a health expert about reducing the risk of transmission to your baby.
- → There is treatment for HIV.
- → Stop stigmatizing people living with HIV.


CAPACITY BUILDING & SHAPING THE FUTURE

WET DREAMS

Sometimes sperm is released while sleeping. Th is is called a wet dream or nocturnal emission. Th is is a normal part of adolescence. Once sperm is made and ejaculation happens, teen boys who have unprotected sex can get someone pregnant





CHANGES IN BOYS

- → Body size will increase. Including the legs, arms, scrotum, penis and testes.
- → Hair on genitals, stomach, face, under their arms, and on their legs.
- → Voice gets deeper.
- → He may begin to have erections. This is normal.
- → Body begins making sperm. Semen, which is made up of sperm and other body fluids, may be released during an erection. This is called ejaculation.




RELATIONSHIPS

WHAT IS CONSENT?

Sexual consent is an agreement to participate in a sexual activity. Before being sexual with someone, you need to know if they want to be sexual with you too. It's also important to be honest with your partner about what you want and don't want.


Consent is:

- → Freely given: no threats, no harm, no coercion
- → Reversible: you can say stop or no at any time.
- → Specific: saying yes to kissing doesn't mean you've said yes to all!

CHANGES IN GIRLS

- → Breasts develop
- → Feet, arms, legs, and hands get bigger
- → Hips get wider
- → Hair in the genital area, under the arms and on legs.
- → Maybe oily skin and sweating.
- → May get pimples.
- → Will start getting your period.
- *→ Can become pregnant.*

WHAT IS GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE?


Gender-Based violence is harm directed at a person based on their gender.

GBV can be:

- → Rape
- → Child Marriage
- → Economic abuse
- → Physical violence against someone
- → Emotional or verbal violence

- → Be a supportive friend. Listen and validate. Help them get medical attention and seek counseling at a
- → Youth Friendly Centre.
- → Intervene with a trusted friend or adult of you see violence happening
- → Speak up!!




EQUAL ACCESS TO FACT BASED SEX EDUCATION

END CHILD MARRIAGE

Child marriage is a union between two people in which one or both people is below the age of 18. Children under 18 cannot give legal consent to the marriage because they are not considered an adult.
