



Supporting members & midwives during COVID-19

As of mid-March 2020, CAM hosted regular meetings of the **National Task Group on COVID-19**.

This group included leadership (volunteer and staff) from all member associations.

Meetings continue to serve multiple purposes:

- Information sharing between jurisdictions, including Federal information.
- Identify common themes so that CAM can issue statements and advocate appropriately.
- Identify if a province or territory requires support for local advocacy and provide staffing support.

Excellent Care Supporting members & midwives during COVID-19

On March 18th CAM put together an internal **COVID-19 Staff Task Group**. The objectives were to **ensure that member associations and members** were supported with **useful clinical and non-clinical information related to COVID-19** for themselves and their clients.

To this end, CAM published a COVID-19 Members Bulletin twice per week. CAM also created a members only website to share relevant information regarding COVID-19.



In May, CAM brought together an interprofessional working group of perinatal health care providers. They included: NACM, CAM, CAPWHN, CINA, CFPC, SOGC, SRPC.

Develop and distribute resources to the Canadian public and midwives that promote midwifery care, choice, and birth as close to home as possible.

Strengthen positive alliances and partnerships with key stakeholders.

CAM supported the inaugural meeting of the National Group of Racialized Midwives, Students, and Allied Workers in June 2020.

CAM supports meetings of the **Canadian Caucus of Queer and Trans Midwives** throughout the year – in–person meetings at the CAM conference and by videoconference.

CAM waived student membership fees in 2020.

CAM advocated for **federal student funding support** during the pandemic.

CAM waived fees for students to attend our learning series *Knovember*.

In November 2020, CAM held its first-ever virtual conference. Throughout the month, CAM hosted:

- 644 participants
- 17 live sessions
- 26 pieces of permanent content
- 4 anti-racism workshops
